# Spokane Is Waiting!

The City of Spokane, Washington, is ready to welcome you to their neighborhoods.

Plans are well under way for the 2009 Neighborhoods, USA Conference—set for May 20 through 23—when the temperatures will be starting to warm and the lilacs should be in bloom. The average temperature in May is 66° with a low of 43°.

Early registration deadline has been extended until May 1. This means that your mailed registration must be postmarked no later than Friday, May 1, 2009 or your completed on-line registration (www.nusaspokane.com) must be received by May 1, 2009 in order to get the \$225 early registration rate. Registrations received after May 1 are \$325 and must be received by May 6. There will be no on-site registrations.

"With a theme of 'Our Place is Your Place,' says Jonathan Mallahan, City of Spokane's Neighborhood Services Director, " of course we'll have great workshops about safe neighborhoods, community-oriented policing, neighborhood planning, and how to get people to participate in their neighborhood. And we'll walk you through our neighborhoods and take you on a tour of our parks and gardens, with options for all fitness levels, including wheelchair accessible tours."

Mallahan continues, "But we'll also have a unique 'Healthy Communities' track that will get you moving with a 5K Fun Run/Walk as well as a bike tour, neighborhood walking tours, and healthy food options. Bottom line: We want you to take what you learn and create healthy initiatives in your community."

"And, there'll be lots of opportunities to have some fun. You won't want to miss our whitewater rafting trip on the Spokane River just west of the City core, or you could enjoy visiting the historic Silver Valley and Crystal Gold Mine or taking the Spokane Winery Tour. Washington State is known for its robust reds and fruity whites and Spokane has some great examples. See your registration book for details on these special events because space is limited."

"Remember," says Mallahan, " 'Our Place is Your Place' – we hope you'll join us. And don't forget to bring your city lapel pins to swap with the new friends you'll meet at this conference!"

# March Board Meeting Highlights

The City of Fort Worth, Texas hosted the Neighborhoods, USA Board of Directors March meeting. Mayor Mike Moncrief hosted a delectable dinner for the Board on Thursday evening. He provided a warm welcome and informed the Board of past and current happenings in Fort Worth.

A motion was approved unanimously by the Board to accept the City of Little Rock, Arkansas as the 2010 host city for the 35th Annual NUSA Conference. Little Rock eagerly stepped up to fill in when notification from the City of Raleigh, NC was given that it would not be able to fulfill its contract agreement.

The Board received a petition from over 30 NUSA members requesting bylaw changes to reduce the current number of Board of Directors seats from 27 to 21 and the Quorum reduced from 14 to 11. These proposed bylaw changes will be voted on at the General Membership meeting on May 23, 2009. (See p. 5)

In response to changes in the economy, which are impacting so many of our municipalities, the NUSA Board of Directors reviewed and approved numerous changes to the 2012 Host City Bid Package. The final approval of the updated Host City Bid Package will take place on Wednesday, May 20, 2009 in Spokane, WA at the Board of Directors meeting.

The October Board meeting will be held in Little Rock, Arkansas.
